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Der SWP-WebMonitor Cybersicherheit und Digitalpolitik ist ein unentgeltliches, kompaktes Informationsprodukt mit ausgewählten Hinweisen auf aktuelle Dokumente und Analysen zu cyber- und digitalpolitisch relevanten Fragen und Entwicklungen. Alle Titel sind mit einem Link versehen, der meist direkt zum Volltext führt. Die aufgelisteten Beiträge sind nach Namen der herausgebenden Institution in alphabetischer Reihenfolge sowie nach Erscheinungsdatum sortiert. Grundlage der Erstellung ist ein überwiegend festgelegtes Set an Quellen, zumeist von Thinktanks und Forschungsinstituten. Die Auswahl orientiert sich am Bedarf des [Forschungsclusters Cybersicherheit und Digitalpolitik](#) der SWP. Der Auswahl-Fokus liegt auf wissenschaftlichen bzw. wissenschaftlich basierten Beiträgen. Der WebMonitor wird i.d.R. einmal im Monat erstellt, nicht aber bei Abwesenheit des Bearbeiters.

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
